## **SSAA AUBURN SHOOTING CENTRE RANGE RULES**

- 1. The authorised Range Officer is responsible for running the Range in a safe manner, in accordance with the Range Standing Orders, the NSWFR Shooting Range Approval and the Range Rules.
- 2. Range users <u>MUST</u> adhere to the instructions of the authorised Range Officer who is on duty.
- 3. **HEARING** and **EYE** protection, **COVERED FOOTWEAR** and **APPRORIATE CLOTHING** are to be always worn whilst on the range.
- 4. **NO** smoking is to occur on the range at any time.
- 5. An illumined <u>**RED</u>** light indicates the range is <u>**OPEN**</u> and live firing is occurring. During range open times, firearms can be handled under the instruction of a Range Officer.</u>
- 6. An illuminated <u>GREEN</u> light indicates the range is <u>CLOSED</u> and no handling of firearms is permitted.
- 7. To call a Range Officer for assistance inclusive of having them check clear please activate the <u>AMBER</u> range light (switch located left side of bay on target control unit.) and wait for their arrival.
- 8. Whilst on the range the muzzle of your firearms **MUST** always remain pointed down range towards your target and the bullet catcher.
- 9. Upon entering and when leaving the range your firearm <u>MUST</u> be cleared by a range officer and then bagged or cased.
- 10. Non-Licenced individuals may only shoot via P650 and <u>MUST</u> be supervised by a licenced shooter (one on one.)
- 11. The SSAA ASC is a Pistol and Rifle with calibre and muzzle energy restrictions which <u>MUST</u> be adhered too not exceeding 2000 joules (1475 ft ponds.) Please refer to Range Standing Orders for specific calibre allowances.
- 12. The SSAA ASC is an <u>ALCOHOL</u> and <u>DRUG</u> free zone, those deemed to be affected by alcohol OR DRUGS will be asked to leave the facility.
- 13. If a discharged round strikes the range wall, floor or ceiling you are to cease fire clear your firearm, place it on the bench and immediately report this to the Range Officer.
- 14. Firearms can **ONLY** be moved between bays by a Range Officer.
- 15. In the event of a malfunction attempt to clear your firearm then place your firearm on the bench with the muzzle pointed down range, then activate the <u>AMBER</u> light which will prompt a Range Officer to assist.
- 16. If you are unable or unsure of how to clear your firearm **<u>ENSURE</u>** that the muzzle remains pointed down range, place on the bench and activate the <u>AMBER</u> light which will prompt a Range Officer to assist.
- 17. <u>NO</u> cleaning of firearms is to occur on the range, if you wish to clean your firearm, please do in the cleaning room which is located separately within the centre.
- 18. Other than being on ranges 1,2 or 3 No firearms or ammunition is to be removed from their bag or case.
